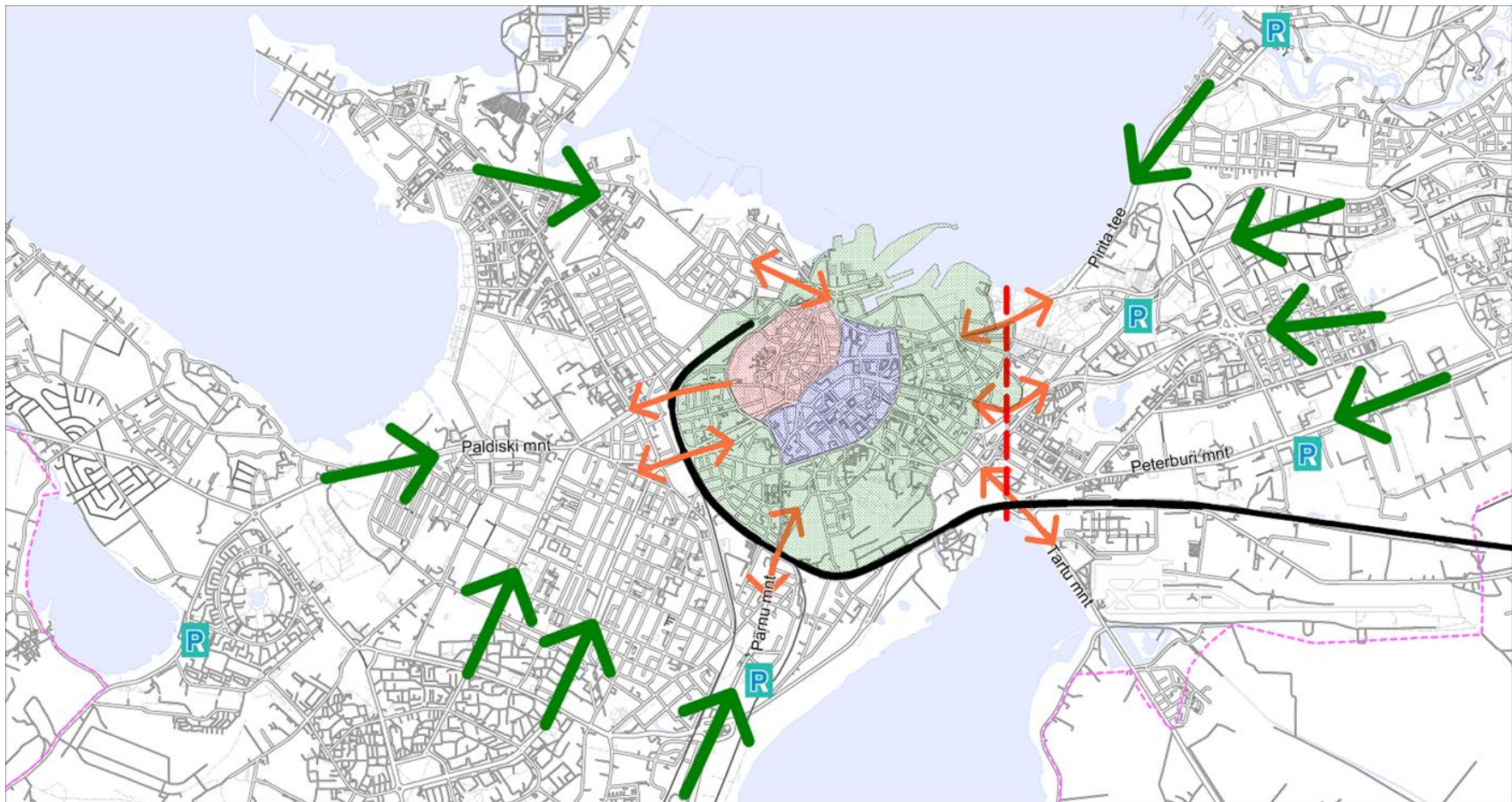

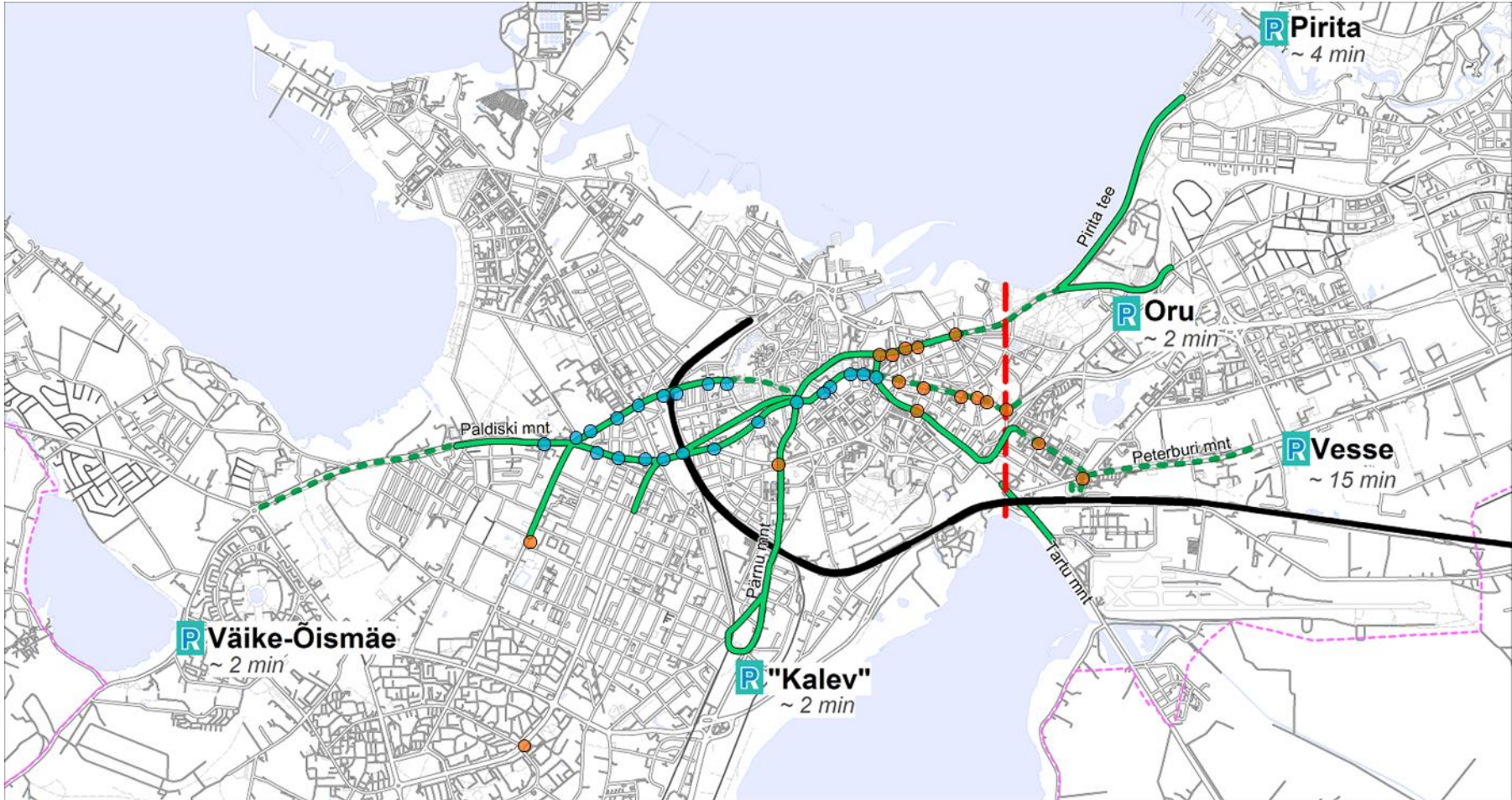

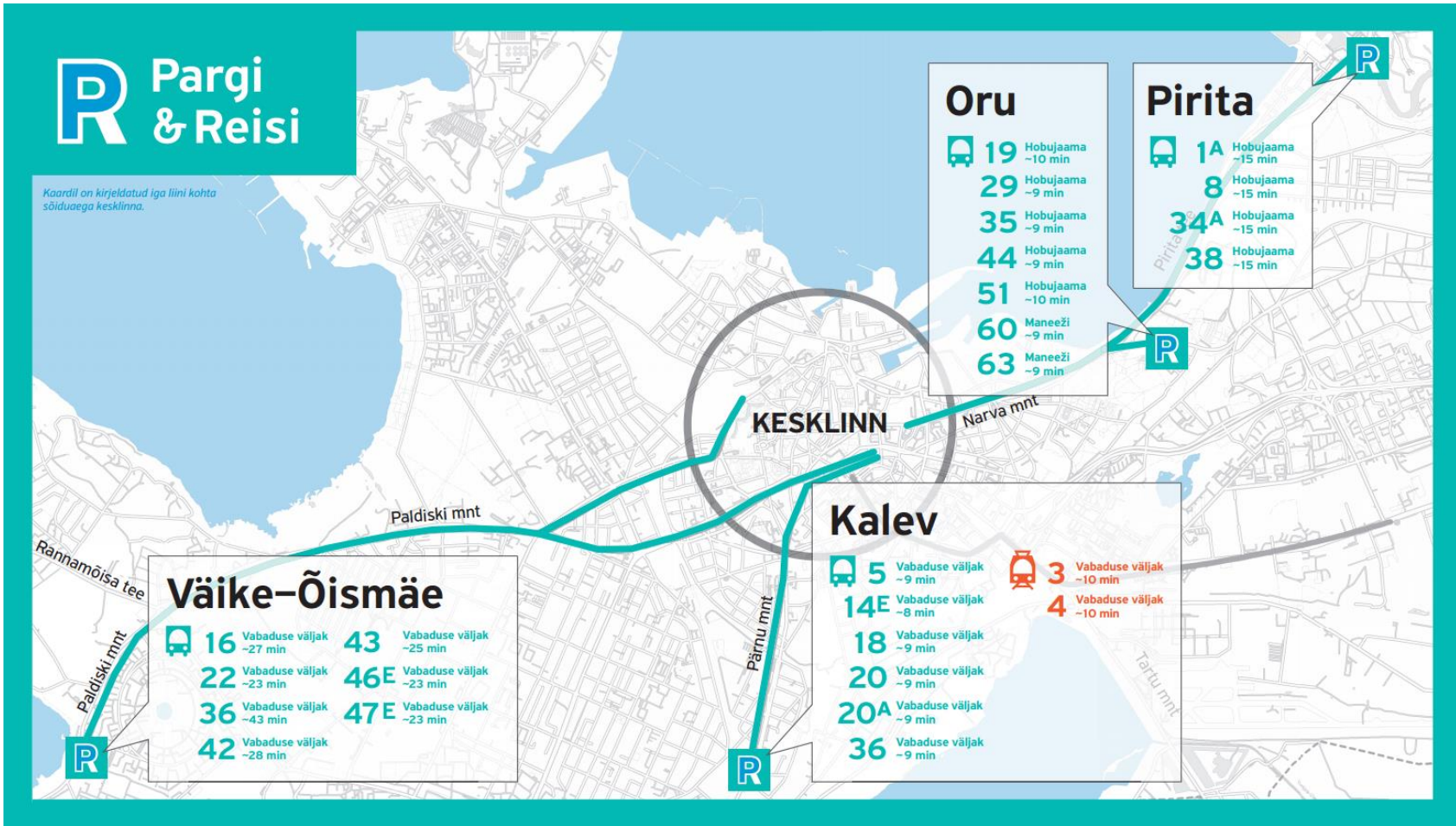

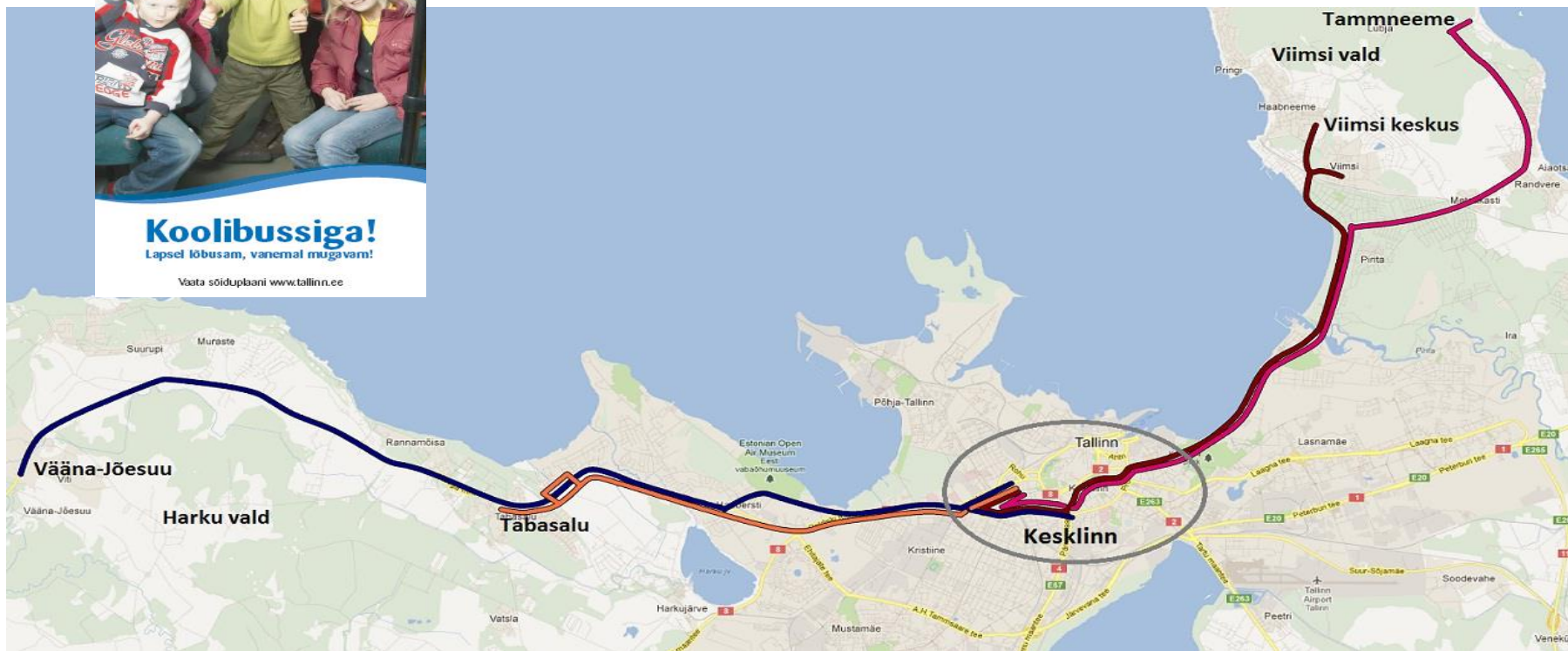

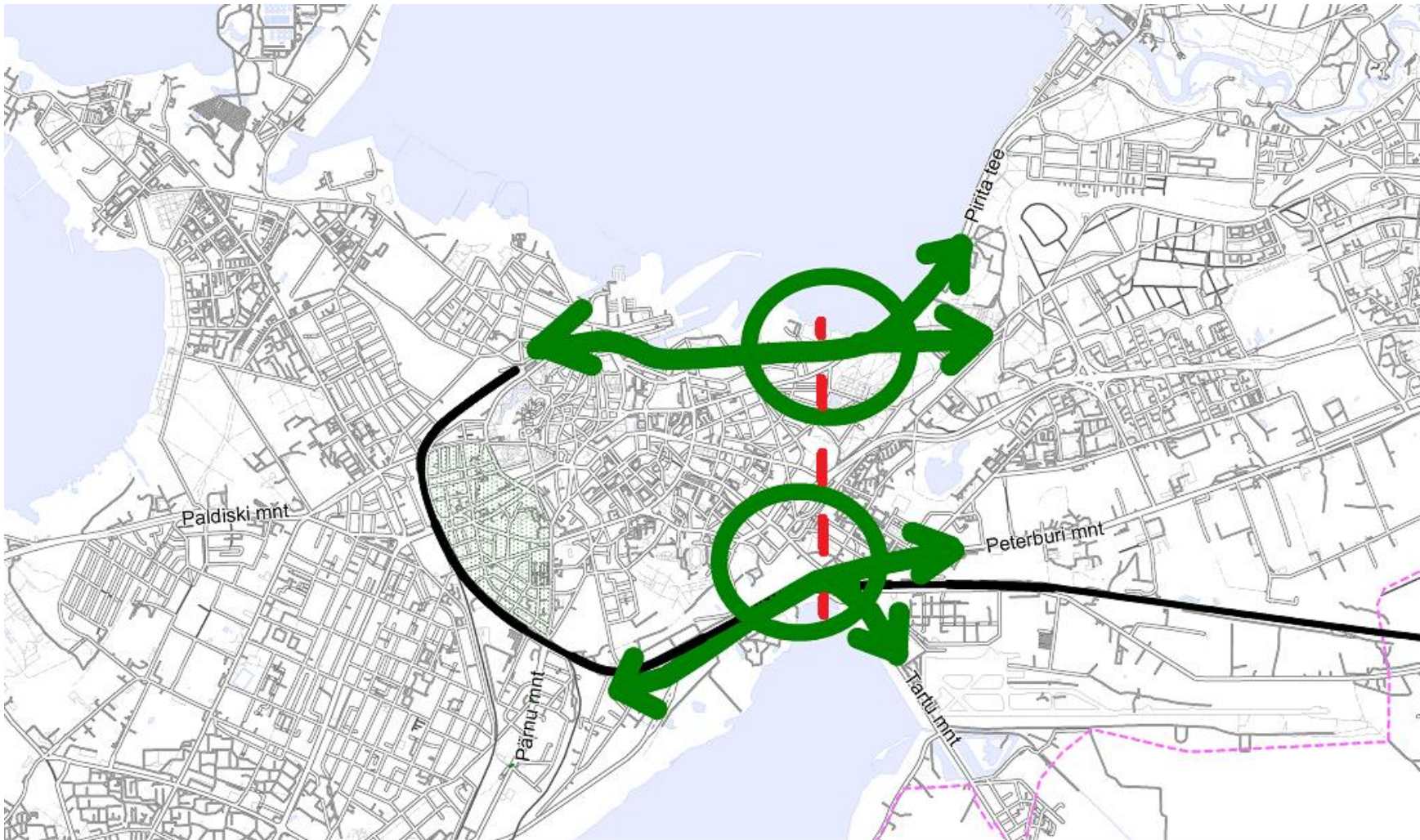


4 different routes from county to City centre

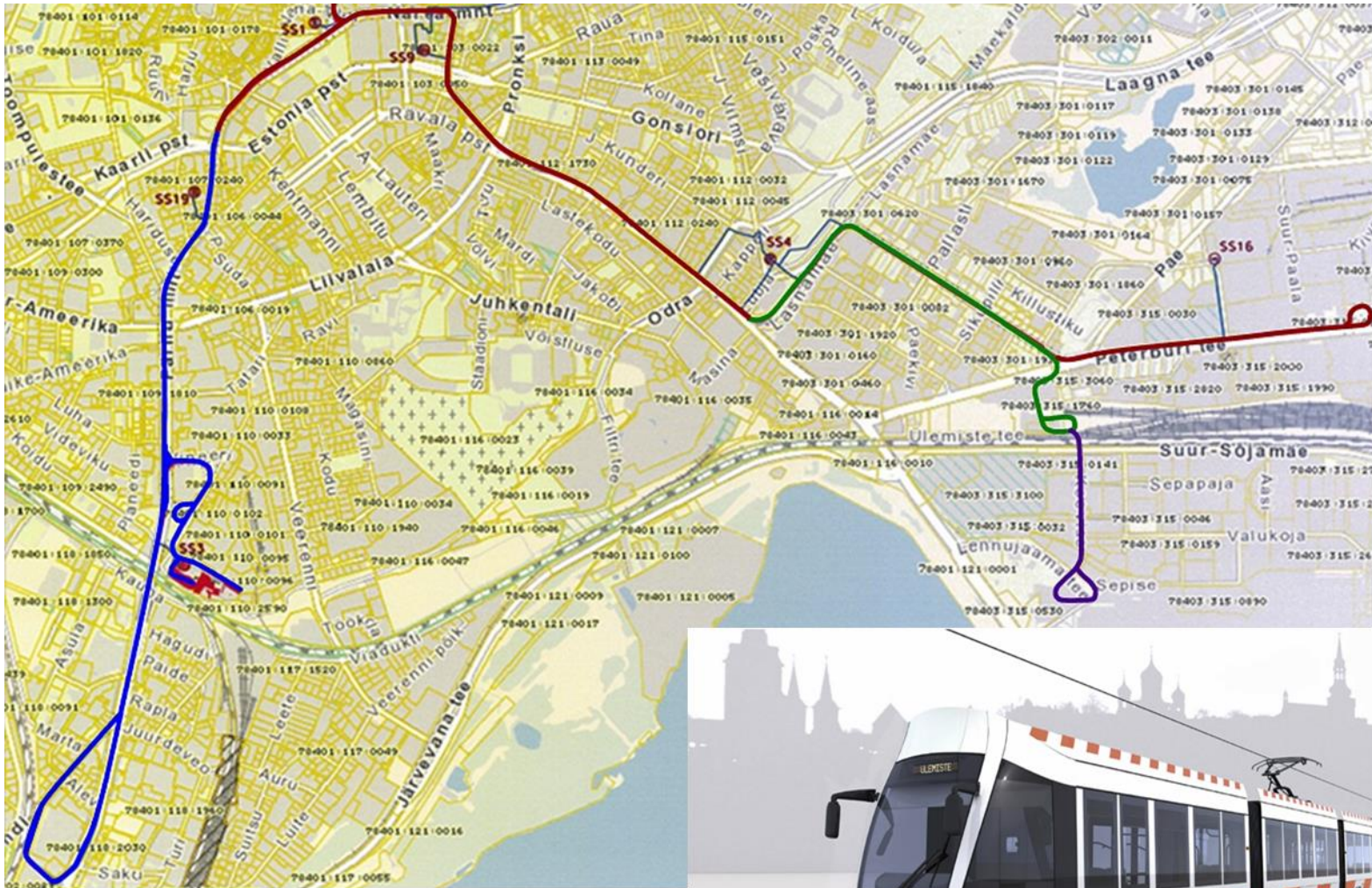

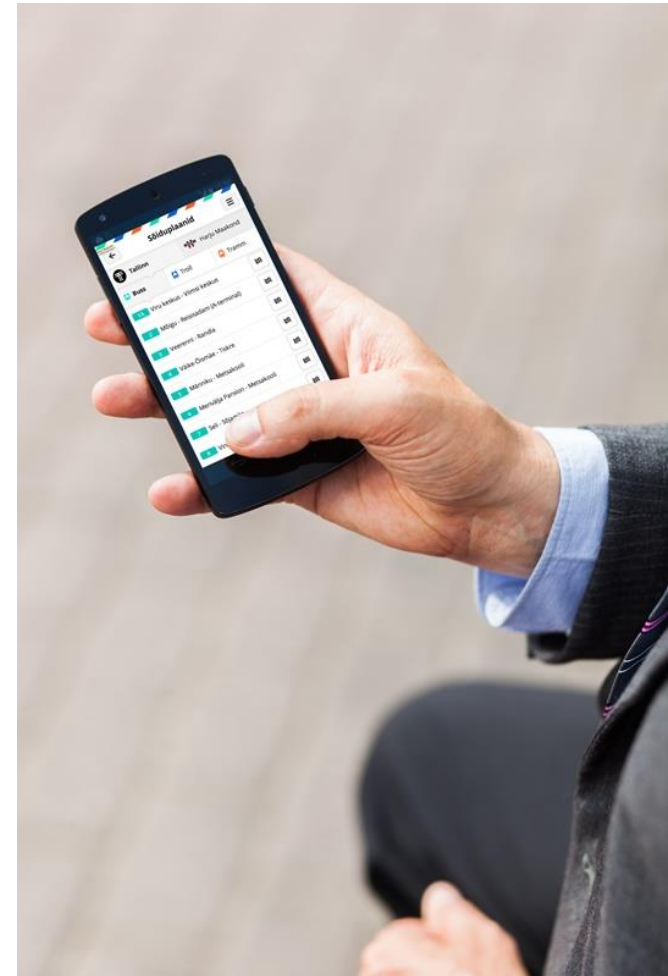

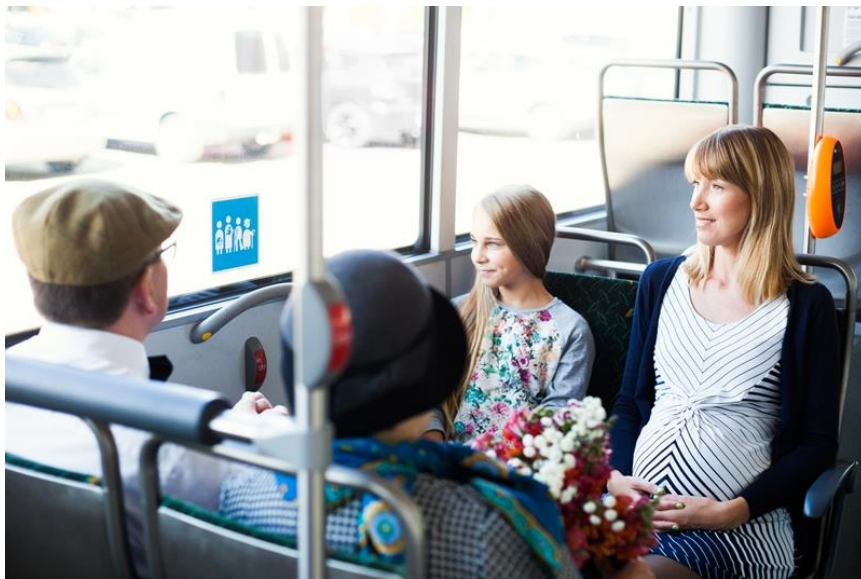

Extensions of fare-free PT

Since October 28, 2013 commuter (electric) trains became free of charge for residents inside the city limits

Number of boardings in zone 1 = City of Tallinn

- 2013: 0,8 mln
- 2014: 1,9 mln
- 2015: 2,2 mln
- 2016: 2,3 mln
- 2017: 2,5 mln

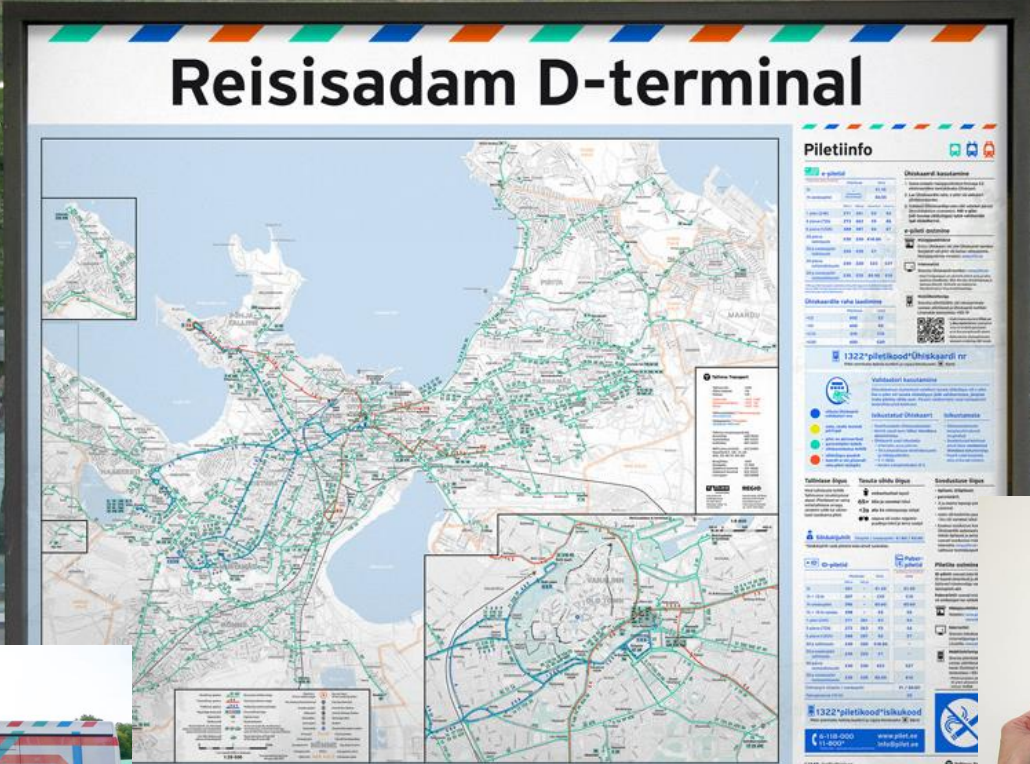


Basic data collection

Ticketing system based on the contactless cards allows to analyse passenger flows by validation obligation in order to improve the public transport route network

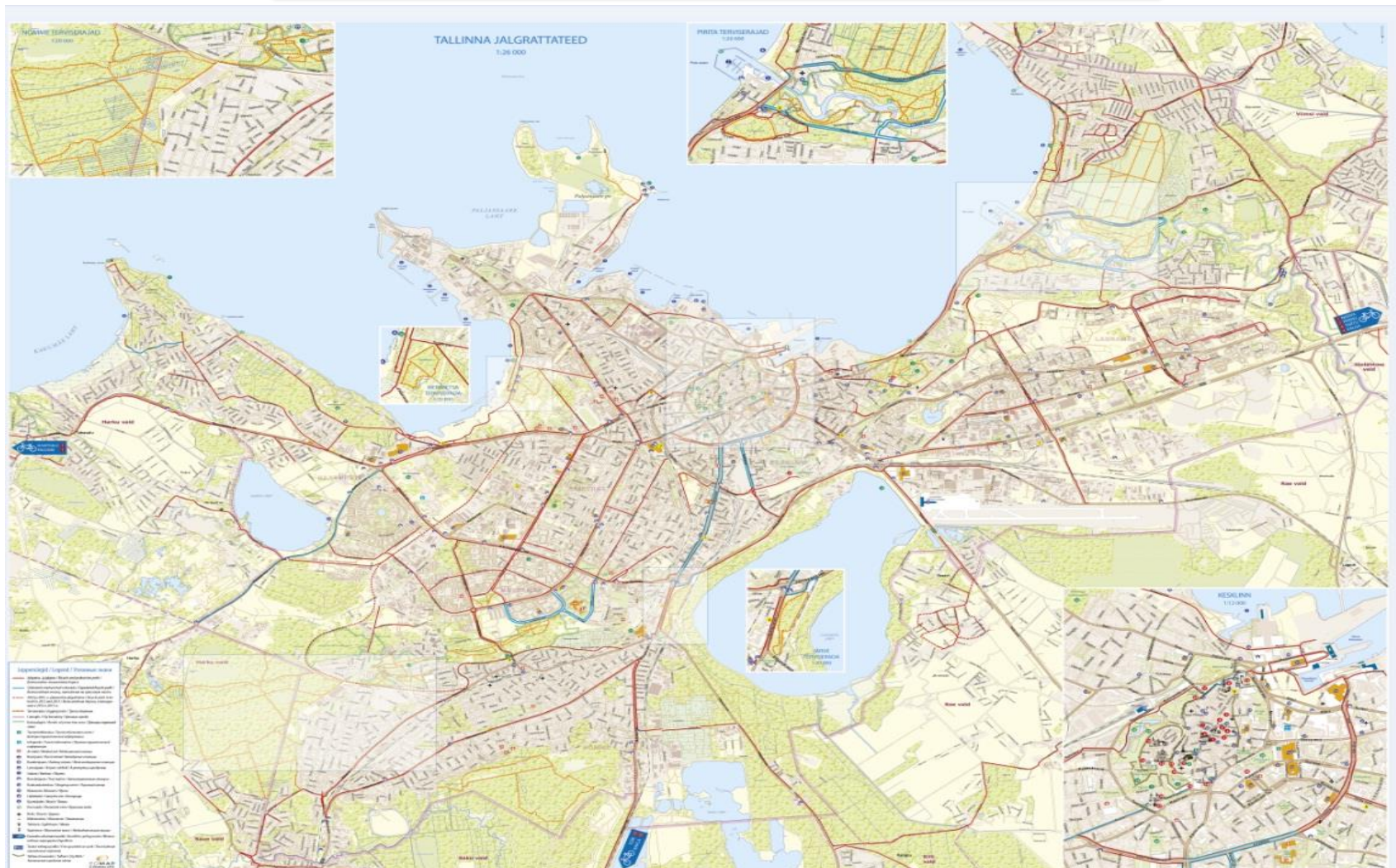

Feedback from passengers

- 74% of the Tallinners used PT in 2017.
- PT is the main mode of transportation on working days for 47% of residents.
- Since the start of fare-free PT, 40% of passengers have often traveled with public transport, as it is free of charge.
- 78% of passengers are satisfied with public transport network and quality.
- Satisfaction has grown year by year.
